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the extent of mental illness concerns in the workforce is becoming increasingly apparent stress depression anxiety workplace bullying and other issues are costing businesses billions every year in lost productivity poor treatments and employee retention unless appropriately addressed issues related to mental illness difficulties will result in stiff financial organizational and human costs for organizations drawing on empirical evidence from north america the united kingdom australia and new zealand the book provides a practical guide to identifying understanding treating and preventing individual and organizational mental health issues the authors illustrate how organizations can save money and improve the health and wellbeing of their employees by using a psychological disability management approach in the treatment and accommodation of mental illness issues this book will meet the needs of human resources professionals administrators of employee assistance programs industrial and organizational psychologists mental health practitioners those teaching or studying psychology and disability management and more generally will serve to enlighten students of business management and practicing

human emotional suffering has been studied for centuries but the significance of psychological injuries within legal contexts has only recently been recognized as the public becomes increasingly aware of the ways in which mental health affects physical and financial well being psychological injuries comprise a rapidly growing set of personal injury insurance claims although the diverse range of problems that people claim to suffer from are serious and often genuine the largely subjective and unobservable nature of psychological conditions has led to much skepticism about the authenticity of psychological injury claims improved assessment methods and research on the economic and physical health consequences of psychological distress has resulted in exponential growth in the litigation related to such conditions integrating the history of psychological injuries both from legal and mental health perspectives this book offers compelling discussions of relevant statutory and case law focussing especially on posttraumatic stress disorder it addresses the current status and empirical limitations of forensic assessments of psychological injuries and alerts readers to common vulnerabilities in expert evidence from mental health professionals in addition it also uses the latest empirical research to provide the best forensic methods for assessing both clinical conditions such as posttraumatic stress disorder and for alternative explanations such as malingering the authors offer state of the art information on early intervention psychological therapies and pharmaceutical treatments for posttraumatic stress disorder and stimulating suggestions for further research into this complex phenomenon a comprehensive guide to psychological injuries this book will be an indispensable resource for all mental health practitioners researchers and legal professionals who work with psychological injuries

the increasing frequency with which issues of childhood sexual abuse come up in therapy highlights the need for an effective short term treatment for these patients imagery rescripting and reprocessing therapy the treatment program described in this book is an information processing schema focused model in which the recurring traumatic abuse memories are treated with a combination of prolonged imaginal exposure and imaginal rescripting with the use of both imagery and verbal interventions to activate the entire fear memory and to identify challenge modify and reprocess the recurring traumatic imagery and abuse related beliefs a more adaptive schema is created the authors comprehensively describe this treatment program offering step by step procedures for each session models of all verbal instructions and written materials given to the patient are included for easy use or adaptation three treatment formats are demonstrated with detailed extended excerpts from actual sessions this readable and informative book is a significant advance in the treatment of post traumatic stress syndrome resulting from early childhood abuse

on symptoms the client's history treatment and the outcome these cases illustrate a variety of problems including mood disorders anxiety disorders schizophrenia personality disorders and various disorders of childhood and aging they also allow students to see how theories in the field can be applied to real life problems case studies in abnormal psychology 5 e provides detailed descriptions and examples of a range of clinical problems illustrates the many ways in which these problems can be viewed and treated discusses the evidence concerning epidemiology etiology and treatment of the disorders in question includes 10 to 15 year follow ups for some patients describing their response to treatment and long term social adjustment features a completely new case of bulimia nervosa treated by cognitive behavior therapy in group format how the case studies are structured each case is presented in depth with a full chapter devoted to each patient many cases include excerpts of dialog from therapy interviews each case is compared with dsm iv diagnostic criteria for relevant disorders some treatment failures are presented as well as successes new discussions are provided concerning gender related issues such as the impact of rape and sexual abuse as well as relational distress and depression all cases end with a discussion of etiology and treatment that illustrates the application of research to individual clients problems and alerts readers to important gaps in our knowledge of abnormal psychology
